"Well, when we first started talking with the leadership at the Erie School District, the main thing was talking about how important it is to protect kid's health, and we can all agree to that. We know that lead is dangerous, and we don't want our kids drinking it in their tap water and the district certainly understood that. So, then it was really a conversation about what are the solutions we need to put in place and the best practices and once we had that conversation, the district was really bought into the idea that the best and most affordable option is to just take those old drinking fountains out that pose a risk and replace them with lead-filtering water bottle filling stations and drinking fountains and that's how they'll protect kids health and they bought into that and moved full steam ahead."
